Accountable Leadership Board Meeting Summary October 17, 2022

The meeting was called to order with a prayer.

Pastoral Updates

Our new District Superintendent, Rev. Dr. Ebenezer K. Insor, is being installed at Brown Deer UMC on 11/22/22. Stewardship letters will be going out next month.

Pastor led a discussion about what is happening in the UMC regarding disaffiliation. The primary issue is how the UMC is addressing the LBGTQ issue. Pastor Cheryl is planning a listening session on this topic for the congregation in November.

Finance Team

Receipts in September are down compared to previous years, but overall YTD receipts are above previous years so they are not concerned.

The 2023 budget is being developed.

ALB Positions

In 2023, Amanda Lichtensteiger will assume the position of Recording Secretary and John Moscicki will become the SPRC Chair.

Kathy Hack is currently our interim ALB Chair and will remain in that position in 2023.

MCCI Team

They are meeting on Monday, 10/24/22, to share what was covered in Stevens Point and to discuss next steps.

Technology Team

All the equipment for the AV corner is in.

Lifeline AV is coming back in November to install the remaining equipment, including the speaker system in Fellowship Hall. The security camera system and Wi-Fi switches are on order. Will be looking at the telephone system next.

Organ Status

The organ is in need of some repairs. Linda Thompson has been able to work around the problems so far. A cost-of-repair estimate has been requested but the need is not immediate.

Jim Gottfried will be forming a committee to review future possibilities.

Trustees

The project to repair downspouts and gutters is progressing. A construction firm has been hired to repair the facia; then the gutter people will come back and to complete their work.

Ministry Teams

Missions: Working on a \$2,000 fundraising challenge, there will be a Rice Meal Pack event in the spring, and planning is underway to support poor families at Christmas.

Hospitality: Needs more help in the kitchen and is having difficulty getting people to signup for coffee hour.

Faith Groups: On 11/20/22, we will have a "Bring your favorite Thanksgiving treat" event during coffee hour. The Youth Group will be selling pies.

Staff Parish Relations

Emilee Mooney has accepted the Communications Coordinator position and has started working in this role as well as continuing as our Christian Educa-

tion & Family Ministry Director.
