John Wesley on Personal Finances

We are embarking on a new year. Many people follow the practice of making resolutions. Often the resolutions revolve around personal finances. Perhaps you spent more than planned on Christmas presents. Maybe you want to be sure that you have enough for a comfortable retirement.

I can't offer specific advice. Everyone's situation is different. Let's go back to our Methodist roots and see where that leads us. Remember John Wesley's three plain rules.

Gain all you can. Great. We are to make as much money as possible. But, Wesley cautioned not to engage in employment that wrecks your health or damages your neighbor. Avoid occupations that could lead people down a bad path. Of course, we should not do anything to earn money that is contrary to God's teaching or civil law.

Save all you can. Don't throw away your earnings on idle expenses. Wesley says we should meet all our needs without living extravagantly. This allows us to save.

Why do we save? Wesley doesn't give us a list, but we can assume the need in Wesley's time was similar to today. We save for unexpected expenses, ours or our children's education, retirement, and something to leave our children. Wesley cautions on the last one to leave enough that your heirs can avoid poverty, but not so much that they will avoid working.

Give all you can. Everything we have comes from God. We are stewards of it while we are here. He quotes Galatians 6:10 saying first "do good to them that are of the household of faith." Then give to wherever you find need. By doing this we establish we are good stewards of what God has given us.
