# From the desk of Pastor Cheryl ...



It's November already! I think I was just typing a message to you about August and somehow the calendar flipped and well, here we are. As I type this, of course, the weather is anything but Fall-like. We are experiencing the last days of sun shine and above 60-degree temps. It will be a while; I am sure before we see this again. But we have hope.

For me, that's what November has always been about. Traditionally it's about gratitude, with All Saints' Day, Thanksgiving, and our traditional focus on stewardship. It's a time in the church administration where we are looking at what has been given to the church this year (and praising God for your generosity), asking folks to commit or pledge to give next year, and using all that to build our budget for 2023.

Hope as they let go of their leaves, hope that God shows us through what colors are left to witness, hope as we begin to think about Advent which begins at the end of the month. We wait for pure white of December, a manger, a tiny baby that holds our hope as the star chants a new morning.

Then burrow deep settle in, listen to the cold and wait for our spring. See you in church!

The meeting was called to order with a prayer.

Pastoral Updates

Pastor Cheryl will be on vacation 9/22 - 10/1.

Confirmation will be on Sunday, 10/2 at both services.

Finance Team

Spending continues to outpace receipts; this is consistent with prior years. Apportionment payments are up-to-date. The Finance Team has no reason for concern at this time.

On October 1, the office will start using the new financial software, running it in parallel with the old software through the end of the year and transitioning to just the new software for 2023.

The deadline for submitting 2023 budgets is October 1.

#### Technology Team

The new projector has been installed; Lifeline AV will install the remaining equipment in November.

The plan is to be finished with AV booth construction and electrical work by end of October.

The purchase of speakers for Fellowship Hall has been approved.

The purchase of a security camera system and the replacement of four switches to improve Wi-Fi throughout the church building is being finalized.

An assessment of the phone system is next.

#### Trustees

Work on the shed is done; the treated wood cannot be painted until next year.

The project to repair downspouts and gutters has expanded. There isn't suitable facia material to adequately attach the new gutters. This will be repaired and then the gutter work will be completed.

Private parking signs are going to be added by each drive to address a liability issue.

Rob Bush is taking over the responsibility of monthly fire extinguisher checks from Jeanne Konrad. Thank you Jeanne for your service.

MCCI

Pastor Cheryl has started MCCI pastoral training: 7 Wisconsin pastors meet with Sue Nilson Kibbey and Scott Carlson each month.

A parishioner has donated the money to pay our church's portion of MCCI cost.

#### Ministry Teams

Christian Education— 55 children are registered for Sunday School, an adult book study is working through "The Chosen," and a new "Prayer Partner" program with adults praying for a randomly selected Sunday School student is starting.

Missions—Planning is underway for a spring rice-meal pack and there will be a Fair Trade sale during coffee hour on 10/30. Hospitality—This team is meeting next week to discuss the Advent Luncheon, Messy Church, and game nights.

Faith Groups–Diner's Delight is starting a new season. Pastor Cheryl is working with Dana Osmanski to develop plans for other faith groups.

Fall is an interesting time of the year for the Finance Team. We're busy looking ahead as we craft an operating budget for the next year. At the same time we need to keep an eye on the current year's income and spending to make sure we're staying on track.

Through September expenses have exceeded income by \$24,683.73. Expenses are a little higher than planned because we are paying a second person filling in for Robin Pfotenhauer while she is on medical leave. Robin volunteers her time in the office. This additional salary was a known risk when we approved the 2022 budget.

It's normal to run a deficit at this time of the year. Giving tends to be highest in the last quarter of the year. September giving was lower than expected, but overall giving for 2022 is the highest since 2018. Thank you to all for your contributions. Please continue what you are doing.

Thank you for answering God's call to host a food pack event in your community. These rice meals show God's love in a practical way to the people of Kyiv, Ukraine. We hope you enjoyed the experience and you will continue to seek projects that bring people of all ages and abilities together to serve.
